## ISQ's History

International School of Qingdao (ISQ), formerly QMIS, is the oldest international school in Qingdao for pre-kindergarten through grade 12 students. Our college-preparatory curriculum at ISQ is North American in nature and is sculpted for our international community.

ISQ was founded in 1996 with eight students. Since then, enrollment has increased to around 230 students. In 2006, AP courses became available to ISQ students, and in 2011 ISQ adopted a 1:1 laptop policy for 7th - 12th grades.

## Accreditations & Affiliations

ISQ is accredited by Western Association of Schools & Colleges (WASC).

ISQ is also a member of the International Schools Consortium (ISC), Association of China and Mongolia International Schools (ACAMIS), Qingdao International Schools Network (QISN), and the East Asia Regional Council of Schools (EARCOS).



## Dual Enrollment

ISQ now offers Dual Enrollment college-level courses through Grand Canyon University, a Higher Learning Commission approved institution. Dual Enrollment courses enable eligible students to simultaneously earn university and high school credit to enhance their academic journey.

The courses are completed within a seven to fifteen week time frame and thus add additional academic rigor to a student's profile.

Grades are reported to students and parents each semester using a standard A to F system. Admission to ISQ is academically competitive with most students attaining an average of B- or better. Any mark below D- is considered failing. Students transferring from another school only receive credit for a C grade and above. The table (left) indicates the letter grades, percentages, and point values used at ISQ.

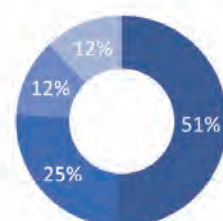
Each Honors course receives an additional .333 point. Each AP course receives an additional .667 points.

The cumulative GPA reported on the transcript is calculated only from courses completed at ISQ.

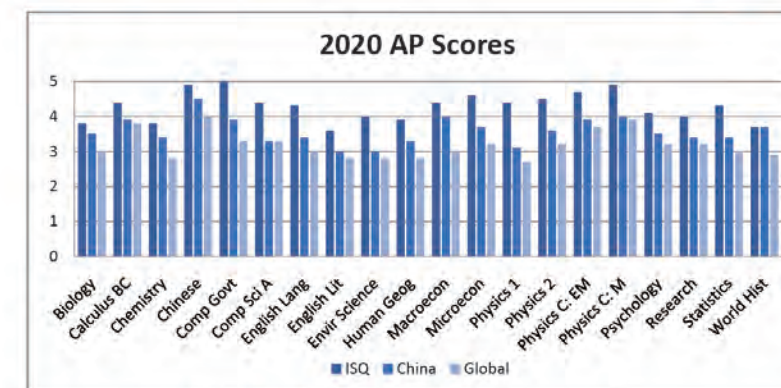
### AP Passing Averages

## Graduation Requirements

Twenty-four credits are required for graduation. Most ISQ high school students take seven to eight courses each semester. One-half credit is given for each full semester of a course successfully completed in grades 9 through 12. A failing grade does not earn any credit. ISQ students are supported in developing characteristics of servant leaders through several opportunities but they are not required to earn community volunteer hours to graduate.

Credit requirements include:

- English: 4
- Sciences: 3
- Social Studies: 3
- Mathematics: 3
- Second Language: 2
- Philosophy: 4 (or ½ credit for each semester enrolled)
- Physical Education/Health: 2
- Fine Arts: 1
- Electives: 2 (or as needed)
